# Introduction

Red Hat Ansible certification is available for technology partners that develop and maintain Ansible collections and agree to co-support their Ansible content for joint customers of Red Hat and the partner.

The certification process is intended to help joint customers by indicating that the partner is an active member of the Ansible Community. Red Hat devotes development and support resources to help resolve any issues that may arise with partner Ansible content. All Ansible certified content is distributed through automation hub.

In order for Red Hat to certify partner Ansible collections, partners must:

1. Complete the prerequisites described in this document.
2. Follow the workflow described in the accompanying [Certification workflow guide](#).

# Prerequisites for Red Hat Ansible Certification

To begin the Red Hat Ansible Certification process, you must complete the following prerequisites:

1. Join the [Red Hat Partner Connect](#) program.

Partners looking to certify Ansible content should first sign up as a Red Hat Connect for Technology member. The Connect program is designed for software, hardware, systems integrators, and cloud hosting companies to align, build, test, and certify products on the Red Hat portfolio.

## 2. View and accept the [Red Hat Connect Ansible Automation Certified Content Appendix](#).

The Ansible Automation certification program is a shared statement of support for certified Ansible content between Red Hat and the ecosystem partner. Partners should review and agree to the terms of the Red Hat Connect Ansible Automation Certified Content Appendix.

## 3. Register for [TSANet membership](#).

Partners certifying Ansible content must be active members of TSANet. TSANet is a vendor-neutral, not-for-profit organization that facilitates collaboration between Red Hat and its partners.

There is no charge to the partner to register for TSANET membership. The cost of this membership is covered by Red Hat as part of the Red Hat Connect for Technology Partners program benefits for partners.

Interested partners should register as a part of the Red Hat TSANet collaborative group.

# Exceptions and revisions to policy

Exceptions to this policy can be requested by emailing **[ansiblepartners@redhat.com](mailto:ansiblepartners@redhat.com)**. Exceptions are granted at Red Hat's discretion.

Red Hat may revise the requirements for obtaining or maintaining Red Hat certification at any time. Red Hat will give partners advance notification regarding any policy revisions.
